

Port Huron gears up for Main Street Memories Car Show

The MainStreet Memories Car Show is set for July 29.

The MainStreet Memories Car Show will return to downtown Port Huron this month.

Car enthusiasts can enter their favorite car or be a part of this year's show, which is scheduled to take place from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. July 29.

“This is a community-based, non-judged car show,” organizers said on the event’s website. “We want everyone to relax and view the many cars, see old friends, make new ones and enjoy the downtown area.”

Registration for the second annual event starts at 8 a.m. and costs \$15. The first 200 people who register will receive a goody bag and commemorative travel mug.

The public is also invited to view the cars on display, which will include several racing vehicles and a monster truck. The show will include a tribute to automotive racing.

Music, raffles, door prizes, face painting and showings of car-based movies at Sperry’s Moviehouse are also planned for the event.

The show is organized by a group of car enthusiasts that includes some of the original organizers of the Downtown Port Huron Car Show.

“We are a committee of dedicated auto enthusiasts who are committed to a grassroots effort to continue to grow the MainStreet Memories Car Show into a more prominent show each year,” organizers said.

Attendees can also check out demonstrations by the Model T Assembly Team at 11 a.m., 1 p.m. and 3 p.m. Local school robotics teams will be on hand to demonstrate what they have learned and built during their time as competitors in FIRST Robotics competitions.

A new arts and crafts show will launch this year. Artisans and crafters are being sought for the show, set to take place during the event at the Port Huron Senior Center, located at 600 Grand River Ave.

Admission to the arts and crafts show is free.

The Council on Aging Inc. is seeking artisans and crafters to take part in the show. For more information about participating, call Karen at 810-984-5061.

Although the car show is non-judged, specialty and sponsor awards will be handed out at the end of the event.

Proceeds will benefit the Council on Aging Inc., serving St. Clair County, a nonprofit organization that coordinates programs to promote and safeguard the independence and well-being of local senior citizens.
