

MainStreet Memories takes over downtown

Classic and unique cars, ranging from American muscle and trucks, to monster trucks and classic war vehicles lined Huron Avenue and Military Street Saturday in downtown Port Huron. Sunlight gleamed off polished chrome and waxed paint.

The show brought in a strong assortment of old and new American muscle cars such as Mustangs, Camaros, Challengers and Corvettes. Some vendors brought in monster trucks and custom rat rods.
